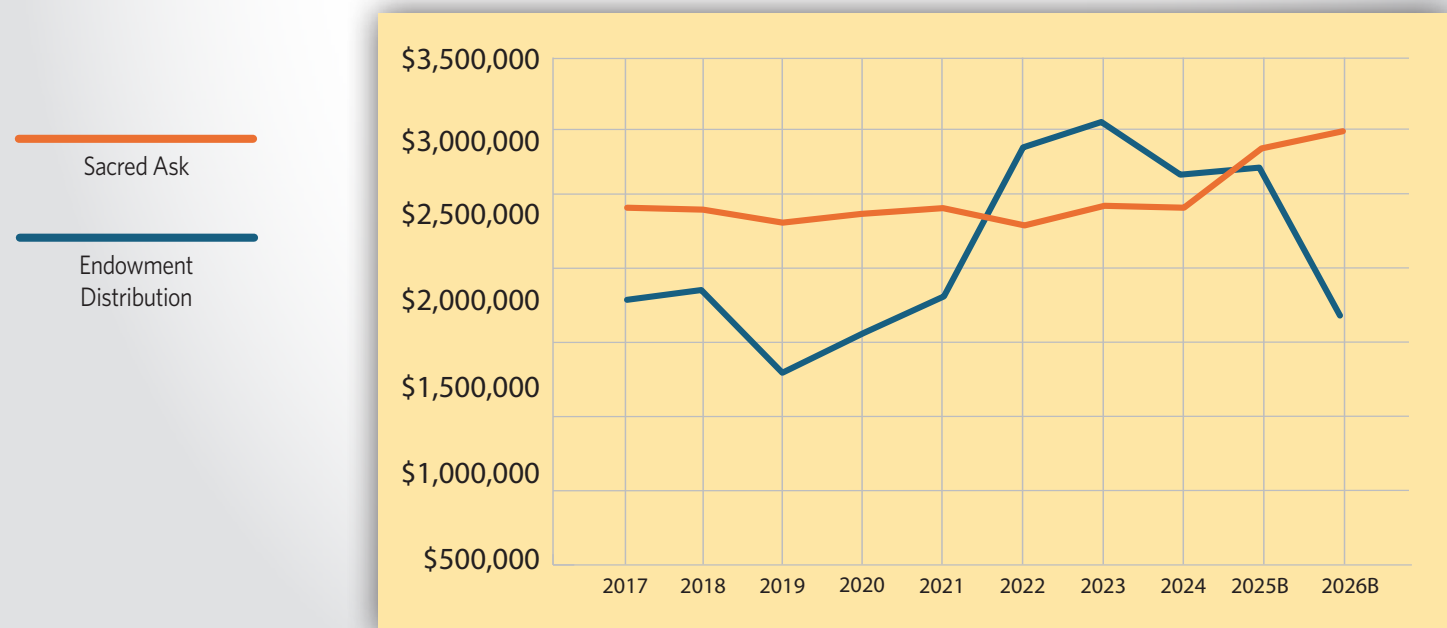


HISTORICAL TRENDS

ENDOWMENT DISTRIBUTION/ SACRED ASK

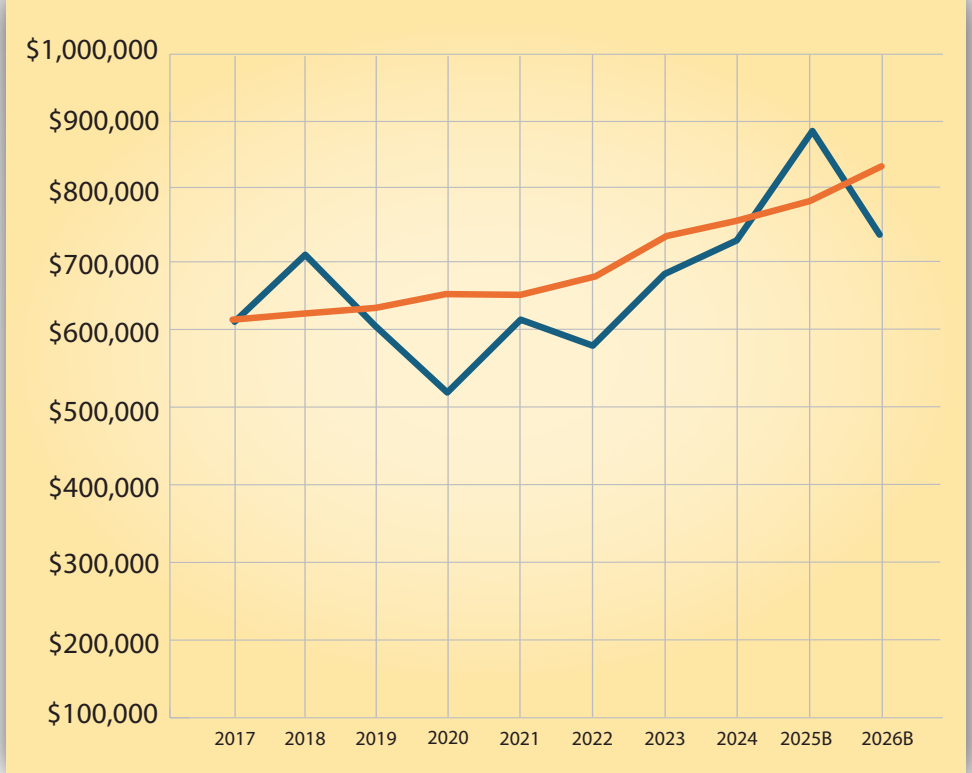

COMMENTS ON THE 2026 DIOCESAN BUDGET

You'll note that the presentation of the budget categories has changed. The expense categories are now reported in three main categories: expenses that support parishes, expenses that grow parishes, and the mission of the greater church. We feel these categories are a more straightforward presentation of our expense plan.

REVENUES

Sacred Ask

In 2026, we are asking churches to pay a Sacred Ask of 8%. We are budgeting 6.5% for the Ask in recognition that some churches may not be able to meet the full Ask in 2026. We feel this is a more responsible approach and want our churches to know we have listened to them and are giving them some breathing space on this Sacred Ask journey together.

Endowment

Our endowment is our other primary source of revenue. We are planning a 5% distribution rate for 2026, which is approximately 2 percentage points lower than our 2025 budget. It is less than a percentage point above the current Church Foundation 2025 recommended distribution rate of 4.25%. This lower distribution rate will preserve our endowment, allowing it to grow for the future while ensuring adequate funding for our mission and operations.

EXPENSES

Vicar Compensation & Benefits

These expenses have decreased due to the elimination of one Vicar position.

Staff Compensation

We have reduced our staff levels since 2017 to maintain lower costs. The decrease in expense is because we have cut a Canon position for 2026. Our Diocese remains one of the largest in the United States with the smallest staff.

Staff Healthcare & Benefits

Increases in healthcare and dental premiums are attributable to this increase.

Administrative and Operational Expenses

We strive to control these expenses as responsibly as possible. The Diocesan Maintained Properties include: Advocate, Phila., Ambler Campus & the acquisition of Old St. Paul's, Phila. (ECS), St. Jude, Lafayette Hill; Crucifixion, Phila., & St. Stephen's, Phila.

Expenses that Grow Parishes

Most of these proposed expenses have either been reduced for 2026 or maintained at 2025 levels. We continue to prioritize the costs that are necessary for our mission while attempting to reduce spending.

Net Surplus (Deficit)

We propose an almost balanced budget for 2026 with a \$29k deficit, resulting in a final reduction in budgeted expenses of \$258,500. This contrasts with our \$746k deficit in 2024.
